

## Troubleshooting



1. Start from the square corner and begin to peel the paper at a 45 degree angle to the screen.



1. If you are still having difficulties you can use a cylindrical object such as a dowel to assist. Starting from the square corner wrap the film around the dowel and begin the roll.



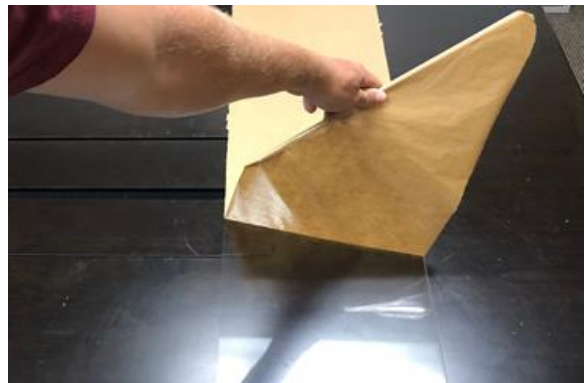
2. Pull slowly, applying equal force across the length of the paper. If it begins to rip, stop and gather the paper as a single piece again. It is easiest to remove the paper as single sheet.



2. Apply equal force across the dowel.



3. Once you have reached the opposing side from where you started, begin to pull the film along the length of the panel. Apply equal force across the entire length of the piece being removed until it is completely off.

**\*\*If in a cold climate it can help to use a source of heat such as a hair dryer or heat gun to warm up the sheet so that the film is easier to remove. Do not overheat as it can cause damage and warping to the piece of acrylic.**
